# THE ORDER OF MALTA RAISED A DONATION OF 100,000 EUROS FOR THE RECONTRUCTION OF DOCTOR'S TOWER

The Embassy of the Sovereign Military Order of Malta, which deals with humanitarian work, organised, in cooperation with Help Them association from Milan, an auction of priceless watches in Milan where 100,000 euros was raised to reconstruct Doctor's tower or build or buy a new establishment.

The money raised at this big humanitarian watch auction, with the help of our embassy in Belgrade, will be used for sick children in Serbia. It was decided that we use the money in the project of reconstruction of *Doctor's tower*, where another Parent's house will be done- explained Sonja Spirito, secretary of the ambassador of The Order of Malta.

Doctor's tower is a two storey 19th century building nearby Clinical Centre which has not been used for decades due to disrepair. Two years ago, a project was made to reconstruct this building and 700,000 euros is needed.





This Parent's house will shelter temporary children and parents from all over Serbia who are medically treated at hematooncological wards in *University Children's Hospital* and *Oncology and Radiotherapy Research Centre of Serbia*. Unfortunately, the reconstructing work has not started yet, because the money is not provided. Thanks to the funds raised, the construction works should start as soon as possible.

There are two temporary Parent's houses in Belgrade, but after reconstructing Doctor' tower, the problem of sheltering and housing children with cancer will be permanently solved. The house will have the capacity of taking ten families in a time, enough space for playing and socializing, as well as the office space for the association. It is situated nearby the hospitals where the medical treatment is taken, which is significant.

# THE AMBASSADOR OF THE ORDER OF MALTA VISITED HEMATOLOGY PAEDIATRIC WARD IN TIRSOVA

The ambassador of the *Order of Malta*, his Excellency Alberto di Luca, visited our children at the pediatric hematology ward of the University Children's hospital together with the head of the municipality *Savski Venac*, Tomislav Đordević and members of NURDOR.

One of the basic strategies of curing children with cancer is spending as less time as possible in hospital. Consequently, most of the children, when their health allows it, undergoes therapy through daily hospital. In most of the cases, when they undergo radiation therapy, the children do not have to be hospitalized.

Homelike atmosphere and the presence of parents are philologically significant for a child under medical treatment. This is why families coming from all over Serbia will have a place to stay in Belgrade during the therapy- noted the ambassador di Luca, pointing to the importance of the reconstruction of *Doctor's tower*.

#### FOR THE OCCASION OF WORLD CANCER DAY OF CHIL-DREN WITH CANCER, WORLDWIDW ORGANISATIONS FOR FIGHTING CANCER IN CHILDHOOD STARTED A CAMPAIGN FOR EARLY DIAGNOSIS OF CANCER AND SAVING A NU-MEROUS CHILDREN LIVES



Today is the International Childhood Cancer Day. The International Society of Pediatric Oncology (SIOP) and the International Confederation of Childhood Cancer Parent Organizations (ICCCPO) are launching a targeted grassroots health advocacy campaign to better educate the public in recognizing the early warning signs for childhood cancer.

Each year 175,000 children worldwide are diagnosed with cancer, of which an estimated 90,000 will die from the disease. The exact number of new cases is not known because in many countries not all children with cancer are registered and many are not ever even diagnosed correctly. These figures are staggering given the fact that 70% of all childhood cancers are curable when diagnosed and treated early. Cancer is the second leading cause of death among children in developed countries. The most common type of cancer in Europe, Americas, East Asia and among the Caucasian population

is Acute Lymphoblast Leukemia, whereas Burkitt's lymphoma, associated with malaria and infection from the Epstein Barr virus, accounts for half of all childhood lymphomas in African countries.

"The symptoms of cancer can often be interpreted as common childhood ailments" warns Dr Gabriele Calaminus, the president of SIOP.

The following symptoms, if persistent, could be signs for childhood cancer:

- White spot in the eye, new squint, blindness, bulging eyeball.
- · Lump in abdomen/pelvis, head and neck, in limbs, testes, glands.
- · Unexplained prolonged fever over 2 weeks.
- · Loss of weight, pallor, fatigue, easy bruising or bleeding
- · Aching bones, joints, back, and easy fractures.
- · Neurological signs: change or deterioration in walk, balance, or speech, regression of Milestones
- · Headache for more than two weeks with or without vomiting, enlarging head

While eighty percent (80%) of children with cancer survive in wealthier countries, the reality is vastly different for those living in resource-poor settings and where 80% of all children with cancer live. This is compounded by the fact that these are the same places where there is often an absence or a lack in knowledge about what childhood cancer is. Not only is childhood cancer detected too late for effective treatment, it is also compounded by limited access to appropriate treatment, resulting in approximately eighty percent (80%) of children with cancer dying. Dollman, a South African parent, explains: "delayed diagnosis significantly diminishes survival rates. While in resource-rich countries, 8 out of 10 children survive, only 2 to 3 out of 10 children will survive in low and middle -income countries".

Today, SIOP and ICCCPO, with its members from around the world will be reaching out to communities, schools, hospitals, and the public in general. Parents will be working alongside pediatric oncologists, pediatricians, nurses, public health advocates and others in disseminating vital information about childhood cancer.
